Henrietta "Hank" Jefferies donated this trophy in honor of her aunt, Louise Richardson Sawyer, who though she was blind, sailed Hobie 14's in Naples Bay until she was 78 years old. Her crew was a woman of the same age who could see but could not sail! An inspiration to all sailors everywhere! In 1992, by an overwhelming majority, the club voted to change the name of the event to the Richardson Cup Race.
